1

First line charge for workers' welfare, salaries, gratuities, and pensions

The above flows from the close link between formal and informal workforce in Osun State. When state workers are well treated, the informal sector booms as Osun for now is almost a civil service state. So in your policy work, you must be mindful of likely impact on workers, both within and out of government. Our policies and programmes must be workers' friendly.



Osun state suffers multi-billion naira capital flight in the last 12 or so years. That unfortunate past is responsible for this agenda of localisation. This implies government patronizing local suppliers and contractors. State fund thus revolves within the local economy, deepening state growth and ensuring local economy expansion. We are to address infrastructure gaps through local affordable options. Part of localisation is our direct labour policy.

This reduces cost of projects, ensures standard monitoring, creates local jobs and empower local business class. You must therefore avoid exporting contracts and services outside the state except where there is no local alternative. We must not repeat the error of the past which was responsible for the present precarious state.

Agro-based Industrialisation for wealth and job creation for youths and women

Osun is a state blessed with multiple resources as a traditionally agricultural state. Our Industrialisation efforts should be agricultural based in addition to other sectors such as solid minerals. We must create industrial parks, agriculture processing zones alongside our free trade zones.

Development of values chains of agricultural products to access local and international markets. This will energize and engage our women and youth.



Boosting state economy by business partnering and support for business class

Osun faces twin setback of poverty and unemployment.

To change the narratives, boosting state economy via business partnership and market operators across all gender.

We must introduce policies that will increase the state GDP through prosperity of the business community. In return, a booming state economy will employ more job seekers and enhance tax revenues to bridge the infrastructure deficit.

So we cannot afford to pursue anti-business policies and programmes because such line hurts state economy. Our revenue drive must therefore factor business survival as a rule.

People-focused social policy through skillbased education, affordable health care, state security, and social security support

Osun was in the past a victim of fanciful policy designs which neglected the people and relegated their interests to the background. We must run a people-centric government. Have it at the back of your mind that the principal goal of government is the welfare of the people. n November 27, 2022, Senator Ademola Adeleke took the oath of office as the 6th Executive Governor of Osun State, and right on that podium, made some promises. One such promise was that "... from education, health, mining sector, agriculture, road infrastructure, and supply of portable water, let it be known that it is no longer going to be business as usual. "To cynics, it was a tall order, practically impossible to achieve. The strength of their scepticism stem from the extent of burden that Governor Adeleke inherited, which they feared will frustrate the fulfilment of his




WELFARE Upon Governor Adeleke's ascension to office, he inherited 30-month half salary of workers owed by the previous administration. 

otion began to reflect in their salary less than two months after the conclusion of the promotion

The experience is not any different for pensioners in Osun state. Between November 27 and now. Governor Adeleke has expended over N17 billion in pensions and gratuities payment out of the humongous over N76 billion liability inherited from the previous government. On November 8, 2023, Governor Adeleke did something unprecedented, not just in Osun but the whole of Nigeria, as he enrolled the entire retirees in the state on healthcare coverage. The intervention, which will benefit at least 23,000 pensioners in Osun state, will take off the burden of managing the health challenges that confront the senior citizens, which usually come at a huge cost to them, and are difficult to handle, causing untimely deaths.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Governor Adeleke, no doubt, has left critics confounded as far as the infrastructural renewal of Osun state is concerned. From the time he took office and now, Governor Adeleke has constructed and delivered over 50 kilometres of roads across the state, while about 50 kilometres of roads are at different stages of completion. Broken culverts were restored for public use while channelization of waterways was undertaken by the Adeleke administration to prevent homes from being washed away by flood.

To cap it all, Governor Adeleke in October last year unveiled an ambitious infrastructure plan, underscoring his firm desire to address the infrastructure deficit and open up the state for industrialization to drive meaningful progress and prosperity for the people. The infrastructure plan, which had

already commenced and at different stages of execution, included the construction of at least five overhead bridges. The 10-span Oke-Fia bridge is at an advanced stage of completion, while Governor Adeleke recently flagged-off the construction of the IIe-Ife overhead bridge. And to note that the infrastructure plan will be funded without any loan from financial institutions to the extent of burdening the future, making it even more superb. The infrastructure plan is not just about overhead bridges. The dualization of identified roads in Ede, Osogbo, and Ilesa to open up the state is ongoing and at various stages of completion. In addition to this, Governor Adeleke will be undertaking the construction of a total of 55 kilometers of roads across the state, with each local government having at least 1.5 kilometers to improve connectivity and enhance the local

economy. This is aside the ongoing effort to link town through road networks, like the ongoing Telemu, Ifon, Erin-Osun, Ikire, Otan-Ayegbaju and a host of others.

Additionally, the administration is working to deliver on its promise of State Airport. Osun is the only State in the South West without an airport, a narrative the governor has declared unacceptable. The administration is sorting out all technical hindrances. Very soon. construction will start on a new site. The old site is adjudged by the Aviation

authority to be non-compliant with aviation and Airport standard.

The Adeleke-led administration has also secured the resolution of the National Automotive Council

co m men c e the Igmi eme ntati on of the Mechatronic centre at Esa Oke. The centre has remained largely undeveloped for a long time. We have interfaced with the federal agency for the commencement of actual work.

Osun State, presently, is a huge construction site as most of the projects were ongoing simultaneously with most of the completion periods spanning 12 months from the time of flagg

ZERO TOLERANCE FOR ABANDON **PROJECTS**

In line with the Governor decision to ensure that no project was abandoned either inherited or freshly inaugurated, the governor within his first 100 days in office ensure the completion of Kobo-Ikirun sectionof Osogbo-lla Odo-Kwara state boundary road project with provision of street lighting at the Ikirun section.

Also, the governor mobilized contractors constructing the Osun-East circular road back to the site to complete the second lane of the project. Today, the second lane of the project, which was initiated by the administration of Ogbeni Rauf Aregbesola, has been completed from the Ilesa Garage section to Oke-Bale roundabout Road users and stakeholders in Osogbo have continued to applaud the governor for his bold move to ensure the project is not abandoned.

conjunction with OyoState Governor, Engr. Seyi Makinde was neither abandoned nor tampered with. The Governor review the project to further widen its scope.

EDUCATION

Sometime in 2023, the Vice Chancellor of the Osun State University, Professor Clement Odunayo, provided a chilling testimonial on the transformational leadership of Governor Adeleke, It was un usual, going by Prof. Odunayo's admission, as he detailed the intervention of the governor that revived a 52-office complex that was abandoned by the previous administrations. According to him, the Governor Adeleke-led administration is the first government in the state since 2010 that will execute a capital

project in the institution's history. It is worth noting that the access road to the teaching hospital of the institution being built by its Chancellor, Folorunso Alakija, is undergoing construction after prompting by the Vice Chancellor

A similar intervention was extended to the University of Ilesa, which recently took off, following the diligent foundation process. The university took off with 40 accredited courses and a sound management team, setting the pace for an institution that will last the test of time.

That was not all. Public school buildings across Osun state are getting a major facelift to give students and teachers the right environment to advance qualitative learning. In the first phase, a total of

31 public schools across the state received total overhauling and unlike the experience in the past, students will now learn in well-structured classrooms with the right facilities, while teachers will no longer need for tree shades to hold meetings or conduct their official businesses due to dilapidated offices. The second phase is already ongoing, and just like the first phase, public schools in the state will not just be conducive for learning but also fitting for young

people who trust it for their learning.

In an effort to address manpower shortage in public schools, Governor Adeleke approved the recruitment of 5,250 new teachers and education officers. Upon the completion of the recruitment process, successful candidates will undergo intensive training to be able to

deliver on the core goal of impacting knowledge on pupils and grooming them to academic success. This is the first time in the history of Osun that a governor will recruit 5000 teachers at a go. Impressive!

HEALTH

In the area of healthcare, Governor Adeleke's record of achievements is unprecedented. Upon assuming office, Governor Adeleke observed the mounting needs of the people for healthcare. In the short term, Governor Adeleke introduced the Imole Surgical and Medical Outreach, which offer healthcare interventions to the people across the nine federal constituencies. By the end of the second phase of the healthcare intervention, no fewer than 50,000 people have benefited from free healthcare services that range from surgeries for cataracts, pterygium, hernia, and some swelling on the body. Some other beneficiaries received treatments for eve problems and even got free glasses, while basic ailments like malaria also got treatments.

In the long term, Governor Adeleke is rehabilitating a total of 346 primary healthcare centres across the state to ensure better access to healthcare anywhere in the state. The rehabilitated healthcare centres will be powered by solar to enable a 24-hour power supply, while medical supplies to make them more effective will be provided. To achieve the desired objective of better healthcare, the Adeleke administration involved the people at the various local governments. Under this arrangement, the representative commitment, which is drawn from religious bodies and artisan groups, would monitor the rehabilitation of the healthcare centres to ensure that they are delivered to specifications.

Governor Adeleke approved and paid 100% hazard allowance for the state's health workers as approved by the federal government last year. As a result of this gesture, Osun was the only state in Nigeria that its health workers did not join in a nationwide strike last year. Millions of households in Osun state received 3.5 million Long Lasting Insecticide Treated Nets (LLITN) procured by the Adeleke administration at no cost to them while the government launched the HIV/AIDS treatment surge for effective treatment and monitoring of the viral infection cases, thereby reducing the incidence/prevalence of the life—threatening disease.

MINING

When Governor Adeleke assumed office, the state's mining sector was in a hopeless situation. The mountain of outstanding charges and uncertainties on the state of mining licences are some of the issues that pervade the sector. Within 16-month, Governor Adeleke has cleared the outstanding debts inherited from the past administration on the state mining licences, took steps towards converting state's exploration licences to mining licences and secured the knotty issue of the state's shareholding with Segilola Mining Company. At the heart of Governor Adeleke's mining sector agenda is the people, and this explains why he mandated Segilola Mining Company to tar the Iperindo-Ilesa road as part of its CSR while prioritising the award of scholarship and job opportunities to indigenes.

curb the menace of illegal mining through the setting up of task force. On the environmental impact, Governor Adeleke is working with the mining company in the state on the safe disposal of wastes and making the environment safe for residents.

WATER

Governor Adeleke inherited a water crisis in the state. Most of the water dams in the state are in a state of disrepair, just as the water pipeline in frastructure was a Imost non-existent. It was a big issue that could not be solved overnight, and in the short-term, Governor Adeleke initiated mass sinking of boreholes to meet the people's immediate water needs. In Osun state today, there is hardly a ward out of the 332 wards that is without a motorized borehole to serve the water needs of residents. The second phase of the installation of

332 motorized boreholes will commence shortly to deepen access to clean and drinkable water for the people of Osun state in the short term.

In the long term, the Adeleke administration is embarking on a major repair of water workstations across Osun state to make sure that homes can enjoy portable and clean water in the long run. Governor Adeleke has approved the award of an N1.3bn water contract for the rehabilitation of the Ora water work scheme, which services the Ignomina area of the state. In the second phase of the infrastructure plan, Governor Adeleke will unveil the rehabilitation of the lwo, Ede, and Osogbo water workstations to boostaccess to water in the state.

CLIMATE CHANGE

Governor Adeleke is conversant with

the reality of climate change and its impact on the people. This explains the series of efforts he has taken so far, part of which has attracted the interest of the World Bank. At the moment, the Adeleke administration is exploring innovative ways of combating the crisis in order to limit the impact on the state

This is in addition to the ambitious climate agenda of the administration in protecting the environment from the catastrophic impact of climate change. The gains of the Adeleke administration are already bearing fruits as the National Council on Climate Change selected Osun state as a pilot site for the carbon investment project. What this means is that the Ago Owu Forest in Avedade Local Government of the state will participate in a project aimed at supporting the implementation of the Climate Change Action Plan and the Nationally Determined Contributions under the Paris Agreement.

All of these and more are what Governor Adeleke has been able to achieve in 16 months. And the good things about the achievements of Governor Adeleke in 16 months in office is that they are visible, and no matter how hard those in denial try to pretend, they cannot change the fact about their existence. They see the roads; they can see the boreholes installed in their respective councils; they can see and hear testimonies of civil servants and pensioners on Governor Adeleke clearing the mess of the past administration; they can see cables installed in their vicinity; they can see, and even know the many beneficiaries of the Imole Surgical and Medical Outreach.

In short, they can see the many impacts of Governor Adeleke in one year, although they may find it hard to say it because doing so will expose their lies over time. But what is comforting is that the Osun people, who are the true interest of Governor Adeleke, can see and feel the effect of his monumental achievements in just one year and cherish them so much. And you know what, that is actually what matters, not the wailing of chronic failures.



In the report, a staff of one of the health centres allegedly renovated said, "The government only did a shady job when they came to renovate the health centre in 2020. We have long been cut off from the grid and the government's promise to ensure that we have electricity was not fulfilled. We use kerosene lamp during late night child

labour," an official who pleaded anonymity for fear of backlash said.

Speaking further in the report, another staff said, "Except repainting and changing of the hospital's roof, nothing significant was done here. We thought the government had finally yielded to our pleas of renovating the decrepit hospital but we are surprised what we got afterwards. No water and other things to make the health centre serve the people better," she said.

While the renovation committe was on the field inspection and needs assessment, it was discovered that there are instances where a primary healthcare centre is sharing same toilet or dispensary with the

at those centers.

Bearing in mind all these challenges, the renovation of these health centres begins in earnest and in phases.

Lack of power supply was a constant trend within all the centres and this mitigate against health workers working at night in most of the centres even when the community where the centre is located are in need of 24-hour medical services

The intervention has now granted new quality basic healthcare service to the people in the grassroot as what they see as a privilege medical service before as now become a norm.

By the time the intervention of Governor Adeleke in the primary healthcare system is completed, the rate of maternal mortality and malaria or other health issues would have reduced drastically within the health index of the state.

efore private radio stations spread in Osun State, listeners of the government-owned Osun State Broadcasting Corporation (OSBC) 104.5 FM were only enduring the fading transmission of its programmes.

The equipments, especially transmitter were out of fashion, obsolete and only few metres to internment. The station was fast losing its diehard listeners to the new, digitalised stations. That was the situation the Executive Governor of the state Asiwaju Jackson Nurudeen Ademola Adeleke met when he assumed office in November 2022.

As one who was exposed to quality radio services, in the US, his former base, he found the situation odd and unacceptable; he decided to turn the station around to rank among the best in the country.

He set the machinery in motion and gave them a clear mandate of what he wanted. These efforts hit the terminus on May 22, 2024 when Adeleke

returned to Oke-Baale headquarters of the station and declared open the new digital equipments, six transmitters, inverters and generators.

He went to the occasion, adorning the spirit of his late elder brother, Senator Isiaka Adeleke who incidentally set up the station in 1991 as the first Executive Governor of the state.

In his speech at the historic commissioning, the governor remarked, "when I took over the reign, we met OSBC in a very deplorable condition; the equipments of both radio and television stations were obsolete. What we are doing today is consistent with the five cardinal principles of our government, of which inclusive government is one."

Former Chairman of the OSBC, Ambassador Yemi Farounbi also attested to the disappointing condition of the station and applauded the governor whom he described as a man of honour for having done proud the name of his late brother whom, he said, had a good dream



for the station during his short tenure.

The Special Adviser to the governor on OSBC, Dr Femi Adefila also commended the governor for breathing a fresh air into the station to strengthen its status among its contemporaries.

After he had formally commissioned the transmitters and digital equipments, Adeleke inspected them and had a brief session in the studio.

His announcement of permanent employment to freelance staff of the station electrified the atmosphere; the entire workforce spontaneously burst into jubilation.

Also enthralled by the unexpected news was the state council of the Nigeria Union of Journalists (NUJ) whose Chairman, Comrade Wasiu Ajadosu

issued a release to that effect.

Ajadosu said his members would remain grateful to the governor for putting smiles on the gloomy faces of the beneficiaries.

The Chairman of the Radio and Television, (RATTAWU), OSBC chapter, Prince Adekunle Makanjuola also described the governor as an apostle of possibilities and lover of humanity.

Makanjuola stated,"It further showed the Governor to be a leader who is always willing to do what is right and we appreciate him, and pledge to continue to give our very best."

t was a recognition that not only echoes the reality of the infrastructural uplift that Osun state has seen under Governor Ademola Adeleke to the local population, but also the national audience. Vanguard newspaper, a leading national newspaper, conferred the Personality Of The Year Award— Infrastructure on Governor Adeleke.

The Eko Hotel, which hosted the event was filled to the brim, and conveyed the import of the recognition more better. No fewer than four Nigerian Governors, including the host Governor, Babajide Sanwo-Olu won different categories of award on the night I personally dubbed as #NightOfHonour. Sure, those who have chosen to sell a wrong impression about Osun under Governor Adeleke would be disappointed. But fact, as English writer and philosopher, Aldous Huxley opined about two centuries ago, "... do not cease to exist because they are ignored." The fact about Governor Adeleke monumental strides in infrastructure was the attraction for Vanguard Newspaper in considering him for the award.

And you do not have to take my word for it, just take a moment to listen to one of the country's leading newspaper on why it settled for Governor Adeleke as its Personality Of The Year on Infrastructure. At a visit to convey the award letter to Governor Adeleke in Osogbo, Mr. Jide Ajani who led the top management of Vanguard Newspaper said the interest of the medium was triggered by a viral video of the open commendation of the Governor's infrastructural upgrade at the Osun State University by the Vice Chancellor, Professor Clement Odunayo, and upon an independent assessment, it "discovered what the Vice Chancellor said the video was a tip of the iceberg."

We read your multibillion naira infrastructure plan and its ongoing implementation. You did not play politics with the development of your state."

Looking at Osun and the pace of infrastructural renewal happening, one will have no reason than to go with the assessment of Vanguard Newspaper because it was apt. Since coming to office in November 2022, Governor Adeleke has prioritized changing the face of Osun's infrastructure in a bold drive for industrialization and improving the quality of lives of residents.

And just as Vanguard Newspaper noted, Governor Adeleke is not playing politics with the development of the Osun people. This is why, unlike his predecessor, Governor Adeleke is not abandoning inherited projects because doing so will only hurt the people. Within his first 100 days in office, Governor Adeleke mobilised contractor to complete the 10.5km Osogbolkirun dual carriage road, hence, bringing to an end the years of pain suffered by road users.

Only recently, a former Nigeria President, Chief Olusegun Obasanjo, commissioned a VIP lodge in the Government House, which was left to rot by the previous administration but completed by Governor Adeleke. And as we speak, the construction of the final phase of the Osogbo circular road, popularly known as Ona-Baba-Ona started by the administration of Rauf Aregbesola is ongoing as we speak. Just like those before it, the road will soon be open add to the list of the state's road network and benefit citizens.

In-between all these, Governor Adeleke is also constructing new roads to address the mountain of road infrastructure deficit met on ground. Within his first year in office, Governor Adeleke constructed about 90km of roads in Osun, and unlike the experience in the past, it was spread across the nine federal constituencies that made up the state. In October last year, Governor Adeleke unveiled an ambitious multi-billion infrastructure plan, which not only answers the infrastructural needs of today, but also cater for the infrastructure of tomorrow.

Overhead bridges, dual carriage roads, among other road projects are ongoing in Osun as we speak. This is in addition to the 58.5km stretch of road, ensuring that at least a 1.5km road is constructed in each of the local governments in the state. And it is not just roads that is getting the attention of Governor Adeleke as public schools and primary healthcare centres infrastructures across the state are receiving major upgrade.

In his first year in office, Governor Adeleke undertook a total overhauling of 31 public schools in Osun state and equipping them with furniture and other essentials to improve the learning environment. The second phase of the

infrastructural renewal in the education sector is ongoing at the moment as efforts by the Adeleke administration to reposition education in Osun intensifies. The same physical transformation is happening in the state's health sector as a total of 346 PHCs are undergoing major rehabilitation to enhance output to the public. He's also investing in upgrading water infrastructures to make clean and drinkable water available to the people.

So, it was not surprising to see Vanguard Newspaper recognised Governor Adeleke alongside other distinguished Nigerians in various spheres of life with an award. What the national newspaper did was to affirm what is obvious to all about Governor Adeleke's infrastructural strides in Osun state, except for those who have chosen politics at the expense of reality.

The Dynamics of Governor Adeleke's Five Point Agenda

he bedrock of any government is in its agenda, which we often refer to as manifesto, it is on the basis of this agenda that voters are expected to vote, knowing what each candidate has in stock if elected into office.

Governor Ademola Adeleke of Osun State while campaign in 2022, highlighted five key areas that his administration will focus on to be, Adequate provision for workers' welfare, salaries, gratuities and pensions; Boosting state economy by Business partnering and support for SMEs; Osun funds serving Osun people through homegrown infrastructure policy.

Others are, People-focused social policy through skill-based education, affordable healthcare, state security and social support; Agro-based industrialisation for wealth and job creation for youths and women.

A deep dive in to the administration of Governor Ademola Adeleke since inception will show anybody who cares enough to know that he has stayed through to his agenda and other ongoing programs also indicates that he is consolidating on his agenda as Governor of Osun State.

Workers Welfare

Osun workers had in the past had it very rough with the administration of Rauf Aregbesola, also that of Gboyega Oyetola by Governor Adeleke has proven that what other people called impossible is indeed very possible.

Governor Ademola Adeleke has Cash backed promotion of staff since 2022 and implementation of gradual defrayment of unpaid deductions from workers' salaries by the previous administrations,

Others are;

- Introduction of gradual systematic payment of half salaries owed workers and retirees by past administrations.
- Payment of Two Billion Naira for palliative wage awards from December 2023, which include Fifteen Thousand Naira for public servants and Ten Thousand Naira for pensioners.
- Implementation and cash backing of the 2023 promotion for all categories of civil servants at all levels. At the State level alone excluding tertiary institutions, local governments and primary schools, over 2000 civil servants have been promoted with cash backing
- Appointment of several Permanent Secretaries thereby eradicating, obnoxious policy of the past administrations of the use of Coordinating Directors to serve as Accounting Officers of MDAs.
- Enrollment of numerous retirees on the OHIS scheme to ensure they have access to quality health care
- Continuous payment of full salaries to workers and retirees at all levels without fail despite the tight financial situation.
- Continuous release of bond certificates to retirees under the pension scheme which to date has run into billions of naira at both state and local government levels.
- Ongoing recruitment of new teachers at both primary and secondary levels.
- Approval and payment of 100% hazard allowances for State health workers as approved

by the Federal Government;

- Approval of Grade level 10 as entry point for Nurses in the state.
- Approval of residency training fund for the Uniosun Teaching Hospital.

Boosting State Economy

Over the years, Osun has been described as a civil servants state, meaning that the economic activities in the state runs on the financial capacity of civil servants in the state

Governor Adeleke in the bid to rewrite that part of the history of the state took out Cooperatives from the Ministry of Commerce and create Ministry of Cooperatives and Empowerment, this is so that the state can have a ministry dedicated to relating with SMEs and Business owners in the state.

Without stopping there, Governor Adeleke approved One Billion Naira as a revolving loan scheme for the Cooperative movement in the state to create a pool of revolving loans at single digit interest rate through the cooperatives and micro credit agency.

In addition to that, Governor Adeleke launched the 'State Special Ward Level Cooperative Loan Programme' to provide N3.436 billion revolving loans to cooperative societies in Osun stating that the loan would be provided in three phases of N1.145 billion per phase, with a total target of 45,816 beneficiaries.

The loan is meant for both men and women traders and artisans and that phases two and three of the programme would each have the same number of beneficiaries.

The condition to access the loan is that each beneficiary must belong to a trade association with a letter of character attestation to be provided by each beneficiary from their trade association before disbursement.

In the area of Solid Minerals, some of the achievement of the Adeleke administration includes, Clearing of all outstanding service charges inherited from immediate past Governors on the state mining licenses; Ongoing step towards converting the state's exploration leases to Mining leases.

Home Grown Infrastructure

The idea of home grown infrastructure is to allow Osun money serve people. This would mean that while the government will focus on massive infrastructural development program, the contracts will be awarded to indigenous contractors.

This is displayed when Governor unveiled his Multibillion Naira Osun Infraplan, awarding the contracts under the plan to indigenous contractors.

According to Governor Adeleke, Osun is currently a construction site as evidenced by massive ongoing works across the state, the administration is pursuing the construction of flyover bridges and dualisation of roads as announced in December.

The first phase is billed for delivery later this year, while the Governor has kick started the second phase with the flag off of the Brewery – Palace road dualisation project as well as Ile Ife to flag off the flyover bridge project at Mayfair, with an assurance that the projects will follow due process and compliance with procurement laws are compulsory observance.

Additionally, the Ademola Adeleke administration is working to deliver on our promise of State Airport. Osun is the only state in the South West without an airport and according to the Governor, very soon, construction will start on a new site. The old site is adjudged by the Aviation authority to be non-compliant with aviation and Airport standard.

The Governor Adeleke led's administration has

also secured the resolution of the National Automotive Council to commence the implementation of the Mechatronic center at Esa Oke. The center has remained largely undeveloped for a long time. We have interfaced with the Federal agency for the commencement of actual work;

To further prove this, Osun State Government official logo was designed by an indigene of the state after winning a logo competition as organized by the state government.

People-focused social policy

A driving force for any government are its policies, this is the framework upon which government actions will be build on to improve the life of the people that are being governed.

In the bid to revive the Water Sector of the state, Governor Adeleke awarded a N1.3billion water contract for the rehabilitation of Ora Water works scheme servicing the Igbomina area of the state; Water works at Ede, Iwo, Osogbo and Eko Ende are undergoing targeted rehabilitation; Selected small water schemes across the state have been reviewed in terms of needed intervention to make them operational and also an immediate step on water provision, the administration is pursuing the phased borehole provision for the 332 wards in the state.

Governor Ademola Adeleke was described as a tech friendly Governor in the early days of his administration after he declared a free right of way, allowing for the laying of Fiber Optics Cable in the state through a Public Private Partnership agreement.

The Governor also unveiled the first ever Osun ICT Policy, STI Policy and Domestication of the Nigerian Start up Act. This is after the state has embarked on Osun Google Mapping Project improving the index of the state from about 20% to almost 50%.

In the area of education development, Governor

Adeleke has taken several bold steps in ensuring improvement of the educational standard in state both at tertiary and basic level.

- •The University of Ilesa has fully taken off with more than 40 accredited programmes of study, meanwhile, the Governor had approved the rehabilitation and reconstruction of all internal roads within the University as well as the expansion of the road leading to the university.
- Osun State University continues to enjoy infrastructure expansion.
- Governor Adeleke also approved the recruitment of 5, 250 new teachers and school officers to strengthen teaching and learning. The process of recruitment is almost finalized. The new teachers will soon be announced to the whole state;
- As part of the infra upgrade plan, several schools have been penciled down for complete renovation. Several school renovations are ongoing as noted in the documentary.
- To support the student population in Osun State, the Governor had directed a study to revive bursary awards in our tertiary institutions. The Ministry of Education is to work on the details for a decision by the State Executive Council.

Affordable healthcare, state security and social support

The health sector is keen to Governor Adeleke,in fact if not the one of major priorities of the government.

One of the key driving force is the Imole Medical Outreach. This is a free healthcare initiative of the government to take free healthcare services to different people of the state at different locations and over 50,000 residents of the state had benefitted.

Other areas are;

Ongoing renovation and upgrade of over one

hundred Primary Health Care Centres across the state;

- •Millions of households in Osun State received 3.5 million Long Lasting Insecticide Treated Nets (LLITN) that were bought and given out by the government free of charge.
- •The government Procured Family Planning Commodities, HIV kits, and RDT and distributed them across health facilities in the State.
- •Also, the government launched HIV/AIDS treatment surge for effective treatment and monitoring of HIV/AIDS cases thereby reducing the incidence / prevalence of the disease;
- •Screening of over Four Hundred public servants and giving out free glasses to the people of Osun state at the World Sight Day held on the 12th of October 2023;
- Construction of a Modern Primary Health Care Centre at Sabo, Olorunda Local Government Area of Osun State (under the CSDA)
- Construction and equipping of a Modern Primary Health Care centre at Araromi Olowu in Atakunmosa East Local Government Area of Osun State (under the CSDA);
- Ongoing construction of Modern Primary Health Care Centres in the following locations: Ogbaagba, Odo-Otin (Iwo LG), Oluode (Iwo LG) and Agurodo (Ejigbo LG) all under the CSDA programme;
- •Approval of comprehensive renovation and upgrading of 345 Health Facilities across the State (100-billion-Naira Infrastructure building). This is ongoing;
- Release of funds to procure equipment and make the outreach centers at Oke Onitea and Iragbiji functional.

Agro-based industrialisation for wealth and job creation for youths and women

In the mix of things, Agriculture, women and youths in the state are not left behind, as this is also seen a pivotal tool to improve the standard of living in the state.

The government of Senator Ademola Adeleke is set to implement a cocoa revival plan. The plan has received local and international support. The Ministry of Agriculture has finalized a plan of action which the government is implementing.

Additionally, the Government is working to unveil a tractor leasing programme to satisfy the needs of farmers ahead of the new farming season. Aside the leasing programme, the state is billed to purchase new tractors as a major intervention to support the farming community.

The food security committee set up by the Governor has also finalized its report. The Committee under the Commissioner for Agriculture recommended many innovative steps to secure farmers on their farmlands as well make farm produce available at affordable rates to our people.

High premium is placed on women development. Osun is the first state to act on the resolution of the Nigeria Governors Forum for mobile courts on sexual harassment. The Executive and the judicial arms of government are working to make this a reality.

Osun State government also entered into collaboration with the Federal Ministry of Women Affairs to jointly implement several women empowerment programmes.

On Youth Development, as announced by the Governor in a recent townhall meeting, 'Ipade Imole' In a very short time, the new Imole Youth Corps will be unveiled adding that issues that delayed the start of the programme have been resolved.

For the youth sector, the Governor also announced that he is set to commence a 'Chat

with the Youth Session" with youth stakeholders across across the state, noting that Youth leaders in school and out of school are the target. The government is also setting up Youth Professional Engagement programme. All these are to Empower the youth and develop their capacity as leaders of today and tomorrow.

Culture and Tourism are now seen as the new gold mine across the world. As the cradle of Yoruba people, Osun State have a huge cultural assets to capitalise on and Governor Adeleke has assure the people of the state that his government is implementing a creative industry programme.

The Federal Ministry of Tourism is joining Osun to upgrade all our tourist attraction centres.

The sport sector under the Deputy Governor is undergoing commendable revolution, Aside from promoting games under the proposed sport development commission, Osogbo City stadium is billed for major upgrades.





Gov Adeleke is faithful to his brother's dream--Farounbi

His experience in electronic media has earned Ambassador Yemi Farounbi respect beyond the industry. His tenure as chairman of the Osun State Broadcasting Corporation (OSBC) till date remains a reference point for a good reason. In this interview with TheTabloid.net, Farounbi gives credit to Osun State Governor Ademola Adeleke for upgrading the station's facilities. Excerpts

What does the replacement of old equipments of the OSBC mean to you?

Replacement of the transmitters were a really good and necessary step. The former radio transmitters were old and sometimes finding spare parts had become difficult. For example the transmitters and studios of 104.5 FM Osogbo were installed in year 2002 under Governor Bisi Akande, that is 22 years ago. The transmitters and studios in Orisun FM,Ife, and Reality Radio, lwo were installed in 2005, some 19 years ago under Governor Olagunsoye Oyinlola.

Really?

Yes. Because of old age, and lack of spare parts for maintenance, the transmitters were operating on reduced power output, and severely limited coverage. For those stations to fulfill their purpose and vision to envisaged audiences, an outright replacement of the equipment was necessary. It was, therefore, a very good thing for the governor to have replaced them. Given the unstable situation of electricity in Nigeria, it was equally good for the government to have provided new generators, inverters and UPS for uninterrupted power supply.

How do you feel about the spread of the new equipments?

It was a good thing that the government did not disturb the careful geographic and political balance established during the regime of the first Executive Governor, Alhaji Isiaka Adeleke. The location and distribution not only met the need for adequate media penetration, it also complied with the agreement reached at the creation of the state that amenities must not be concentrated in the capital but must also be dispersed equitably across the state. I, therefore, commended the governor for only replacing the old equipment but also preserving the distribution that guarantees equal and equitable access to the broadcasting output from all parts of the state.

What is the implied message of that action?

By doing this, the governor is ensuring that the labour of our heroes past in the state are not in vain. It's also a way for the broadcasting outfit to reposition itself as the Voice of the South West, a position it occupied in 2003.

How do you mean here?

As at 2003, it was the leading radio station with 28.7% of the audience in South West. At that time, the second station had only 10% of the audience in South West
